Collection Arrangements



It is important that you inform the Goldcrests staff if someone
different from normal is collecting your child either at the beginning
of their session or by telephone.

If parents/carers do not arrive on time, then you will be telephoned.
If we are unable to contact you then we will telephone the people
that have permission to collect your children on the consent form
you have filled in.

Please ensure that telephone numbers are updated as soon as
possible if circumstances or phone numbers change.

Complaints

In the first instance please speak to the Nursery Supervisor. If your
complaint is not dealt with satisfactorily, contact Mrs Miles, the
Headteacher. For full details see the Complaints Policy.

Medical Conditions & Medicine



Please ensure that you inform the school of any medical conditions or allergies (however mild) that your child has.

If your child is unwell and will not be attending their session then please telephone the main school office before 9.30am on the day. Session fees will still be payable.

Please telephone the school office if you are unsure of exclusion periods for particular illnesses. Children who have had sickness or diarrhoea should not return to nursery until they have been clear of symptoms for 48 hours.

Medicines will only be accepted for administration in school on completion of the appropriate form by a parent or carer. Please refer to our 'Administering Medicines Policy'.

Please regularly check your child's hair for headlice and treat if necessary.

Please advise us of any existing bumps or bruises at the beginning of a session.

We will record any first aid that we administer during the sessions.

Toileting

For children still in nappies please provide an appropriate amount of nappies/wipes etc. each time they attend nursery.

We will support your child and you through the toilet training process offering reassurance and praise as they develop their self-care skills.

Goldcrest Sessions

(To be booked in advance via the main school office)

In England all 3 and 4 year olds and some 2 year olds are entitled up to 15 hours of funded early education and childcare (**Nursery Education Funding**) a week for up to 38 weeks a year. Since September 2017 working families who meet the eligibility criteria can also claim an additional 15 hours of funded childcare a week for 3-4 year olds.

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Clothing



We would like our nursery children to wear clothing in which they are comfy and in which they can engage safely in a range of activities e.g. a T-shirt, jumper, trousers and trainers.

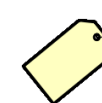
Children should wear flat sensible shoes e.g. no open-toed sandals or high heels.

Children should bring in a coat with a hood everyday as the weather is so changeable. A spare pair of pants and socks is also useful.

All children will be provided with a sunhat that will kept in nursery.

All-in-one suits will be available for use on wet days.

PE kit – Children will need to wear shorts, a T-shirt and a pair of PE pumps for these sessions.



All items of clothing should be clearly labelled with your child's name so it can easily be identified.

Food & Drink

Fresh water is available throughout the day for the children to drink.



Snack Time

Children will be provided with milk or water and a healthy snack comprising of a starchy item such as toast, a crumpet, breadsticks and a fruit or vegetable e.g. sliced apple, carrot sticks etc. A variety of these will be offered throughout the year to give the children opportunities to explore different food choices.



Lunch Time

Children will move into the school hall to eat their lunch.

You can choose whether to provide your child with a balanced packed lunch from home or you may choose to pay for a cooked school dinner.

A lunch menu will be sent home each term so that you can select the preferred cooked dinner for your child.

Children will be provided with water to drink.

Packed lunches should not contain nuts or fizzy drinks.
